Guatemala Water Filter Project by the numbers:

- Helping Hands Medical Missionaries served over 2,000 patient encounters in 5 clinical days.
- Helping Hands Medical Missionaries assisted in raising \$26,000 through the generosity of church members around the US.
- 352 families were educated on the health benefits of clean drinking water, and received new water filters for their home.
- Each filter had a bulk cost of \$47.
- Thanks to your generosity, these 352 filters directly benefited 1,850 persons who now have clean drinking water at home.
