Mission Updated 2019

In February, HHMM was blessed to have 39 missionaries attend our mission in Tanauan-Batangas, Philippines. The group administered loving and compassionate care to almost 2,000 patients. The surgical team preformed close to 90 surgeries. Our team of dentists completed over 330 successful dental procedures. In total, the team, led by Dr. Eddie Jimenez, logged close to 1,500 volunteer hours. On behalf of his team, Eddie would like to thank the benefactors who donated over \$5,750 worth of life-saving medicine and vitamins for the mission.

In March, our small, but determined team of 8 missionaries visited Chiapas in Mexico where the team served over 550 patients in need. The team, which I led myself, logged over 350 hours of volunteer service. My team and I are most grateful for the \$1,000 donation of medicine and vitamins given for this mission.

Also in March, our dynamic team from Wisconsin, led by Dr. Michael Kleoss, visited Ateos, El Salvador. The team of 41 missionaries served close to 1,700 patients and recorded over 2,100 volunteer hours. Dr. Kleoss would like to thank the many benefactors who donated close to \$7,500 worth of necessary medicine and vitamins for the mission.

Rounding out the first quarter of the year, we were blessed with a new opportunity to serve in a place that Helping Hands has never served before—Patzún, Guatemala. The mission team served over 450 patients, logging close to 500 volunteer hours. Over \$2,300 in donated medicine and vitamins were administered during this mission.
