Dear Fellow Missionaries in Christ,

For 19 years Helping Hands Medical Missions has been a constant force for good throughout the world. From our humble beginnings and first missions in Mexico to our groundbreaking missions in Itacoatiara, Brazil (Amazon) and Ghana (West Africa), HHMM has served on all the continents except for Australia and Antartica. Through the countless sacrifices and unwavering determination of our missionaries, tens of thousands of souls have been the recipients of your heartfelt prayers, words and actions.



Now we have completed our 19th year as a medical missionary organization. I am so grateful for the countless gifts that the Lord has bestowed on us: the

The celebration of God's mercy, he [the Pope] said, is "linked, first and foremost, to the sacrament of reconciliation and to the celebration of the holy Eucharist with a reflection on mercy. It will be necessary to accompany these celebrations with the profession of faith and with prayer for me and for the intentions that I bear in my heart for the good of the church and of the entire world."

For you, fellow missionaries, those of you that have an ongoing, almost daily encounter with the sick and suffering, you will be able to pass on God's mercy in a special way through your blessed professions. You are already doing so much in the way of mercy, but I challenge you in the Year of Mercy to live it with even more intensity and love towards your patients and those you encounter on a daily basis.

I thank all of you, missionaries, active and inactive, benefactors and prayer warriors for your incredible generously given in during these past 19 years. As we begin our 20th year of missions we look forward to another great year of service to the poor and the opportunity to extend mercy to all those we encounter in our lives, either on the missions or at home.

May God continually bless you in doing His work and may Saint Luke, Patron of Physicians and Surgeons, Saint Agatha, Patron Saint of Nurses, and Saint Therese, Patron Saint of Missionaries watch over all of you, both now and always.

Copainala Chiapas, Mexico

Date: August 9-17, 2014 Number of Missions: 4 The missionaries presence led by Dr. Stefan Haller, is greatly felt in the poorest state in Mexico. Copainala is a steady growing mission. Patients treated: 850 Missionaries :16

San Salvador, El Salvador

Date: October 24-November 1, 2014 Number of Missions: 14 Besides treating thousands of patients each year, the San Salvador Team, led by Christine Hunter, RN visits local orphanages and the Cerebral Palsy Center delivering many necessary items for each location. Patients treated: 2,276 Missionaries: 39

Santiago Texacuangos, El Salvador

Date: October 31 - November 8, 2014 Number of Missions: 16 This mission is a wonderful example of friends inviting friends.

The friends inviting friends culture was developed by past mission directors and is now being sustained by Dr. Peter Danis. Thousands of people are being helped each year thanks to the many generous missionaries.

Patients treated: 3,250 Missionaries: 50

Santa Maria de Jesus, Guatemala

Date: November 7-15, 2014 Number of Missions: 9

This mission team serves a large Mayan population. The efforts of Dr. Michael Brezinsky and Ellen Miller, RN and team members have provided the local people new water filters and the teachings of Natural Family Planning.

Patients treated: 1,732 Missionaries: 20

Tanauan, Philippines

Date: February 12-21, 2015 Number of Missions: 9 Since 2005, the people of Tanauan have been the recipients of medical care from a number of great HHMM missionaries. A mission that was almost cancelled indefinitely, due to lack of participants is now one of the fastest growing HHMM missions, which included 12 missionaries from the same family! Thanks to the efforts of Dr. Eddie Jimenez who has led the team for the past 6 years. Patients treated: 1,614 Missionaries: 37

Escuintla, Guatemala

Date: February 27 - March 7, 2015 Number of Missions: 13 Dr. Alma Levy has been successfully, directing this mission for 12 years. Through Alma's determination and loving care for the people of Escuintla they have also begun the planning of a new church building for the community. Patients treated: 1,224 Missionaries: 21

Ateos, El Salvador

Date: March 13-21, 2015 Number of Missions: I An amazing 1,500 patients were treated on this mission thanks to the efforts of Dr. Michael Kloess, and a well-organized ground team. We look forward to future missions at this site and amongst the grateful people of the region. The local parish priest, Fr. Leopoldo Sosa Tolentino prayed for help for many years and now it has arrived in the form of generous HHMM missionaries. Patients treated: 1,500 Missionaries: 16

San Cristobal de las Casas, Chiapas Mexico

Date: May 22 – 30, 2015 Number of Missions: 3 The community that HHMM serves is located in a mountainous region. The missionaries were especially touched when arriving at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine, they encountered, at the same time the pilgrimage from the three Dioceses of Chiapas as they were entering for their special Mass at the main altar. The work of the HHMM missionaries in the Diocese



of San Cristobal de las Casas has been a blessing from heaven for both patients and missionaries themselves.
